

## **The Things You Might Need to Put in Your Car for Outdoor Painting:**

Tarpaulin to protect the car boot

More tarpaulins or old sheets to protect the surroundings eg neighbouring fences

Something heavy and/or some ropes to stop the above from blowing away

Sandpaper and sanding block

Pots of paint

Paint stirrers. Popsicle sticks are good for small tester pots.

Paint brushes

A flat head screwdriver to open the larger paint cans

A hammer to shut the larger paint cans

Water to clean brushes and several smaller jars to separate clean and dirty water

Plastic bags for rubbish

Masking tape to cover door handles and official box labels.

Scissors

Rags - Plenty in case you need to wipe up a spill

Cling wrap to wrap brush between coats of undercoat and anti graffiti paint, or solvents, jar and rags if you decided to clean the brushes.

Sunscreen and sun hat and/or warmer clothes? Umbrella? Art smock and/or old clothes?

Food and drink?

Safety clothing eg High visibility vest

Advertising eg business cards to give people who stop to chat?

Cotton buds? - these are useful for wiping off small mistakes quickly (Just dunk them in clean water first)

Music and headphones?

Original painting

Whatever you need to transfer the design for instance pencil, eraser, chalk, carbon paper

The enlarged design?

Blu-tac? Used to hold the enlarged picture in place. Also used to hold the ends of string which was used to lay out straight lines

A ruler and/or tape measure?

Hot weather additive for paint?

Something soft to kneel on?

A ladder?

A chair?
